The prayer service will include a reenactment of the sermon Dr. King delivered 50 years ago at Riverside Church. The call of the service will be to end racism, militarism, and materialism, to recommit ourselves to the cause of peace, and to move forward toward what Dr. King called the Beloved Community.

#### Enhancing Our Ministries with Grace and Gratitude

I wanted to pass along news about some wonderful developments that have been happening in our ministry at Grace.

On February 25 and 26, Dr. Marcia McFee visited our church to consult with us about our worship services, and many of you have already experienced the changes. We have committed to singing through many of the transitions in our worship services, to make our worship more participatory, to plan with more creativity and visual elements, and to make everything more meaningful and memorable.

We also have a group that is putting together gatherings for people in the millennial generation (ages 19-35). A leadership group has formed that is contacting members and friends in this age group to develop new ministries and strategies that will involve young adults. We plan to hold small gatherings to listen to concerns, pick up ideas, and scheme for the future over the next few months.

The Administrative Council has set an objective of cultivating our connection with Drake students and other young adults. We have taken several important steps toward developing an internship program for college students to work with the ministries at Grace. Students would receive a stipend to help with our youth program, our music program, our outreach in the community, and to reach out to other college age adults. Representatives from Drake, the Wesley Foundation, and Simpson College have been very excited about and helpful in getting us set up to start with four ministry interns this fall.

I also want to use this space to give a special notice to the staff members who work with our youth group and after-school programs. Nathan DeLange and Patty Link put in countless hours with the youth and parents from our church. Nathan brings his training and experience as a psychotherapist, and Patty brings training and experience as a teacher. But much more than that, they are incredibly good friends and mentors to our young people. They want to spend time with the kids, and the kids value spending time with them. Many other parents provide excellent volunteer leadership and support as well, but I want to ask you to tell Nathan and Patty how much you appreciate the wonderful ministry they make possible.

**Generosity** 

With 17% of the year completed, we have received 16% of anticipated income. A year ago we had collected 16.1% of the amount needed.

14.6% of pledges have been received. Last year 15.1% had been received. Non-pledged gifts are 22.2% of estimated.

#### Disbursements

Obligations paid are 13.2% of budget.

Of our Shared Mission (paid through the Annual Conference), none has been paid. Last year we had paid \$5000.

Treat your family to egg casserole and pastries in the Activity Center following the 10:15 a.m. service on Palm Sunday, April 9. Free will donations accepted.


#### Easter Bake Sale

## Canine Memorial Funds Add Books to Library

Attention, readers of all ages! There are new books in the church library! Funds from the Marjorie Canine Memorial Fund were used to purchase books for children and adults. All books are now available in the blue and white Little Library in the narthex. For a complete listing, visit www.gracedesmoines.org/library.

The new children's books address topics such as Alzheimer's Disease (*The Memory Box* by Mary Bahr), common childhood fears and feelings (*Bedtime for Frances* by Russell Hoban), and connecting children to nature (*You Are Stardust* by Elin Kelsey).

Books for middle school and high school ages include several that focus on social justice (*Sylvia and Aki* by Winifred Conkling), racial conflict in the 60s (*One Crazy Summer* by Rita Williams-Garcia), and taking a stand against deforestation (*Operation Redwood* by S. Terrell French).

Other books include *Becoming Wise: An Inquiry into the Mystery and Art of Living* by Krista Tippett, in which the author has created a master class in living in a fractured world; *Transgender 101: A Simple Guide to a Complex Issue* by Nicholas M. Teich; and *This Is How It Always Is* a novel by Laurie Frankel about a family who has a son who wants to grow up to be a girl.
