#### **Dealing with Death Matters**

Many people avoid talking about death and related topics. It's not something we discuss openly in our culture. But death matters because it's part of all of our lives, like it or not. As Tony Stark (Iron Man) says in Avengers: Endgame, "The ending is part of the story." And while we often don't have any control over death, we probably would cope with it better if we dealt with it before being in the midst of a crisis.

Grace Church member Bob Davis and Pastor Gary Nims invite you to a three-part seminar addressing some of the topics concerning death. While it will be of interest to older persons, we hope that other generations will see the value of addressing questions about sudden (premature) death and approaching death now in terms of their lives today. We also want younger people to be able to help their parents and grandparents talk about death matters.

"Dealing with Death Matters" will be held on Monday, October 28, November 4, and November 11 from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm. We encourage people to be part of all three sessions, but if you have to miss one, each session basically stands on its own. The discussion will depend to some degree on the questions that participants bring, with the following general topics structuring the sessions:

- October 28 Coping with Sudden Death Situations
- November 4 When Death is Approaching
- November 11 Acknowledging a Death in a Gathering

#### **AMOS Housing Summit**

AMOS (A Mid-lowa Organizing Strategy) will hold a Housing Summit on Sunday, October 20, 2019 at 3 pm. It will be held at St. Paul AME Church, 1201 Day St. in Des Moines. We need to have representation from Grace. You don't have to be active in AMOS to come. Even if you have never been to an AMOS event, you are welcome. At this summit we will present the results of our research on housing needs in the city, and ask those running for city council if they will support our agenda. Candidates will not be allowed to give a stump speech; however, they may make timed responses to our questions. In the past AMOS has advocated for, among other things, restorative justice in the schools, the skate park, children's mental health, and the one percent sales tax with some specific asks for its use.

# Bridges 2 Harmony in Concert at Grace

## Celebrations of Grace

One of the great things about Grace is our strong tradition of adult small groups. From Sunday school classes, to Soup and Sermon, to study and fellowship groups, Grace has shown itself to be a church that is thoughtful and engaged with spiritual growth.

At the welcoming gatherings we've had this summer, I've heard several people express interest in Grace offering more groups. We have members that are interested in Sunday school classes, but their Sunday mornings are full; they are wondering if we could have groups that meet in the morning or evening during the week. We have members interested in parenting classes, young adult groups, short term studies, singles groups, and more. We have members that are interested in learning, discovering, and discussing the very same things you are interested in!

Many of you have shared with me great ideas for new groups, and restarting old ones, too. I have heard some of your dreams and hopes for our church. And, best of all, many of you have told me that you want to get involved and make a difference in our church and community.

As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 12, "Certainly the body isn't one part but many. If the foot says, 'I'm not part of the body because I'm not a hand,' does that mean it's not part of the body? If the ear says, 'I'm not part of the body because I'm not an eye,' does that mean it's not part of the body? If the whole body were an eye, what would happen to the hearing? And if the whole body were an ear, what would happen to the sense of smell? But as it is, God has placed each one of the parts in the body just like [God] wanted. If all were one and the same body part, what would happen to the body? But as it is, there are many parts but one body. So the eye can't say to the hand, 'I don't need you,' or in turn, the head can't say to the feet, 'I don't need you.'"

We all have a gift to give, and Paul reminds us that it is the diversity of our gifts that brings us together. Just as Paul reminds us of our gifts, Paul reminds us that we can't say to one another 'I don't need you' which is why I have to write to you all and say I need you.

I need you to share your gifts with our church. I need you to help with leadership in our Sunday school classes and small groups. I need you to share your passion, skills, and wisdom. It is only when we can come together with our various gifts and graces that we can truly recognize how, all together, we become the Body of Christ together.

If there is a group you'd like to start or see restarted, I need to know if you are willing to be a HOST, if you have a Heart for people, an Open mind, can Serve a snack, and Talk with others.

The idea of leading or starting a group can seem daunting and overwhelming at first, but in the end, a great group finds it's way when we open our hearts and minds with a snack and a conversation.

I know there are passions, skills, and connections that we can develop and strengthen at Grace because you've told me your hopes and dreams. The only thing that is keeping us from living into the fulfillment of them is not knowing who is willing and able to be a host.

In recent years, our church staff has been stretched thin, being asked to do tasks that, while not in their job description, are still important in the life of the church. Unfortunately, doing something once quickly became doing something twice, which established it as something the staff does instead of something we as the church do. The Grace staff is here for you to help recruit, resource, guide and develop programs that further the mission and ministry of our church, but that does not mean the church staff is there to do all the work of ministry in our church. The Tuesday medical clinic wouldn't be helpful if I was attempting to give medical advice to our patients and guests. The volunteers and teachers that have found fulfillment and fun leading our youth and children in Sunday school would be missing out if Coreen attempted to teach every grade.

I would love to assist and resource you and the rest of our groups, and, when my schedule allows, I may occasionally lead a lesson, but since I cannot commit to leading every small group, at this time I will not commit to being the sole leader of any one small group. We have to be in ministry together, which means we have to share leadership, which means if you've told me you're willing to help, I need to know if you're willing to be a host.

Please prayerfully consider how you might provide leadership at Grace. The staff and I will help resource, recruit, and develop programs and groups that expand the mission and ministry of our church, but for our ministry to have a lasting difference in the church and community our ministry must always be shared.



#### **FINANCE REPORT**

August 31, 2019

#### GENEROSITY—

With 67 % of the year completed we have received 68 % of anticipated income. A year ago we had collected 60 % of the amount needed. The five year average at this point is 61 %. Anticipated income includes a need for \$48,092 of extra giving or revenue.

69 % of Pledges have been received. Last year 65 % had been received.

Non-pledged giving was 60% of anticipated.

#### DISBURSEMENTS—

66 % of budgeted expenses were paid. The 5 year average is 59%.

Annual Conference Apportionments are not included in this year's budget.
