Guide to Prayer and Study

Monday, June 22

Read - | John 4:7-2|

Notice - "Surely I John 4:16 is one of the most famous verses in the New Testament: 'God is love.' It touches on everything, from the individual-psychological to the radically communal. God is not visible to he human eye at this point in history except through acts of love (4:20); until the last day (and the full unveiling of God's face), the only sure way to connect to God is to practice loving. Love and God go together; hate and God do not (4:20); fear and God do not (4:18)."* Who are the people in your life that are difficult to love? Are there things about them that you can appreciate? What is it that makes them difficult to love? What in you makes them difficult to love? What do you think they would say about you? How might you connect with God by finding some way to love them, remembering that love can come with boundaries, clear expectations, and even making the first step within yourself to move forward.

Pray - God, help me to live with your love. Inspire me to love others because love is from you and you are love. Amen.

Tuesday, June 23

Read - Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

Notice - As the Cultural Backgrounds Study Bible notes, "Personal names in the ancient world provided much more than a moniker...Name generally offered information, at some level, about the person's identity and in a variety of ways names were believed to be intertwined with a persons destiny...In this verse, it is not that God is demonstrating [God's] authority over Abram but more important, [God] is demonstrating Abram's destiny - to be the father of a multitude. The name Abram meant 'the father is exalted... His new name Abraham designates him as the significant ancestor as it looks to future generations yet to be born."* How would you describe what happened in the lives of Sarah and Abraham when God changes their names and destinies? Have you ever wanted to change your name? Why or why not?

Pray - God, just like Abraham and Sarah, you have called me into a new life with your love. Even though I can't always see it, remind me of the ways that my life will make a difference for generations. Amen.

Wednesday, June 24

Read - Isaiah 62:1-4

Notice - What names or words would you use to describe the broken areas in your life or our world? When you read in verse 4, "You will no longer be called Abandoned, and your land will no longer be called Deserted" what comes to mind? This section of Isaiah was written during the Babylonian Exile, a time of political and personal unease, no one knew when, if ever, things would go back to normal again. How does our current context inform or influence how you could read passages like this?

Pray - God, in this passage your Spirit delights in us, seeing us as partners see one another the day they are married. Help me to know that you see me with such great love even when I would call myself abandoned and deserted. Amen.

Thursday, June 25

Read - Genesis 50:15-21

Notice - If anyone in the Bible had an excuse to cut ties with their family, it's Joseph. His brothers were jealous of him, so they sold him into slavery and told their father he was dead. Joseph was beaten, jailed, and enslaved due to their betrayal, and yet, God provided for Joseph and put him in a place to care for his family even though they refused to care for him. Just before our reading today, Joseph leaves Egypt to bury his father, and his brothers are nervous, not knowing what the funeral and family reunion will bring. Joseph says to them in verse 21, "Don't be afraid. I will take care of you and your children." When have you felt like Joseph in this text? When have you felt like his family? Have you ever experienced God's grace breathing new life and hope into the world, even doing so in moments or experiences that felt broken?

Pray - God, sometimes it is only through the cracks that your light can shine through. Help me to remember and know that your love will always win. Amen.

Friday, June 26

Read - 2 Corinthians 5:17

Notice - "In his own translation of 2 Corinthians 5:17, Wesley adheres strictly to the original Greek text: 'If anyone be in Christ, there is a new creation.' He adds, 'Only the power that makes a world can make a Christian.' By the power of God's love communicated to us through Christ we are re-created, our dulled spiritual senses are reawakened."* As God puts the pieces of your heart back together and unleashes new creation in your life, how do the names and words that once described your brokenness and pain reveal your wholeness in God's grace?

Pray - Jesus, in you there is a new creation birthed within me. There is a new hope, grace, and peace, that transforms everything, even me. Reawaken me to your new creation so I can continue to create a new world with you. Amen.



Read - Philippians 1:7-8

Notice - Think back to our sermon from last Sunday as you read this passage again. Has your understanding of these words changed during the week? In verse 7, Paul writes that he has the Philippian church "in his heart". Letters in the ancient near east, like letters in our lives today, often expressed the joy or the sorrow that we share with friends and family. Who do you carry in your heart today? Could you send them a letter and speak words of encouragement and support to them?

Pray - God, you have graced me with family and friends, with a community of love and support that carry one another in our hearts. May the love in our hearts over flow into the work of our hands so together we might witness to your grace and peace. Amen.




Cards for Bill Cotton
