Guide to Prayer and Study - Week of October 19-24, 2020

Monday, October 19

Read - 2 Peter 1:3-8

Notice - John Wesley, Methodism's founder, wrote of this passage in his Notes on the Bible: "In this most beautiful connection, each preceding grace leads to the following; each following tempers and perfects the preceding." Wesley urged Methodists to serve God with their heads, their hearts, and their hands, and this passage pictured qualities that transform our whole life. Cooperate with God to add each of these qualities to your life, Peter said. They will give you everything you need for life and godliness. Peter made the sweeping claim that God has given us everything we need for a godly life. Which of the positive qualities he listed in verses 5 through 7 do you find most appealing? Which of these qualities are already present in your life? Thank God for them! How can you more completely connect with God's spiritual power to add the other good things to your life? Pray - Jesus, remind me that I am never "done growing" in this life. Pour your Spirit into my heart, leading me on from one positive step of growth to the next. Amen.

Tuesday, October 20

Read - Ephesians 4:11-16

Notice - "God's goal," Ephesians said, "is for us to become mature adults... fully grown, measured by the standard of the fullness of Christ." At times we find that unity with Christ and one another is still hard. But God calls us to become spiritually mature so that nothing can knock us off course. Building this kind of community requires us to speak the truth in love, with our understanding of truth grounded in thoughtful Bible study guided by the Holy Spirit so that we become more like our Savior Jesus Christ. All our different gifts need to work together so that we can strengthen and equip one another. What are you doing in your day-to-day life that nurtures spiritual maturity in you and others, building up the body of believers in love? What one or two items are most clearly on your growth horizon right now?

Pray - God, you are building me—you are building us—into a community of spiritually mature people, growing in every way into your life of love. Help me to do my part as a faithful builder growing more and more into your image. Amen.

Wednesday, October 21

Read - Galatians 6:7-10

Notice - Sometimes Jesus' followers also feel the urge to turn their faith into a display piece, untouched by real life's messiness and challenges. But faith is never something to

keep isolated, shiny and "just for show." The apostle Paul wrote about relationships, about how we treat one another. He pictured us as farmers who need to be careful what we plant in the soil of our lives. The point of our faith, he said, is to energize and empower us to work for the good of all. Have you ever gotten tired of doing good? If so, what helped renew your energy to bear good fruit by blessing others? Verse 10 said we should work for the good "whenever we have an opportunity." Do you ever feel that you're stuck, that you have no opportunity to do anybody any good? How can the Holy Spirit's presence help you find creative ways of doing good at any point in your life?

Pray - Je0sus, let your light shine from my life, not out of a shiny display case, but amid the darkness and dirt of real human life. Help me never to tire of doing the good you call me to do. Amen.

Thursday, October 22

Read - Colossians 1:21-23

Notice - Verses 21 and 22 painted a vivid "before and after" image of the change the good news of Jesus had created in the formerly pagan lives of the Christians in Colossae. What is your personal "before and after" story? (Even if your life never literally fit verse 21, recall how Pastor Hamilton often tells us, "I am less of a jerk than I would have been without Jesus.") How often do you remember and thank God for the ability to live in the reality of verse 22? Scholar N. T. Wright wrote, "The effects of the gospel don't happen automatically. Christians... can't simply sit back and do nothing. They must 'keep firmly on'; they must now take responsibility for their own growth to maturity in faith.... Christians must develop their life of faith, hope, and love (see verses 4–5) on this foundation and not somewhere else."* During the rest of 2020, in what ways will you seek learnings and actions that further mature your life of faith, hope, and love?

Pray - God, I could not save myself. Thank you for doing that for me. Now save me from the mistaken idea that I can sit back and do nothing. Guide me as I seek to embody the hope you've given me. Amen.

Friday, October 23

Read - Romans 5:1-5

Notice - The apostle Paul sketched the spiritual growth process through which every Christ-follower can develop a character that meets any of life's dark twists and turns with hope and trust, not despair. Greek literature featured stories that showed humans growing more noble through terrible suffering. Paul writes that as we meet trouble with God's grace and hope, we grow. In Paul's day, "realists" said the Christian message he preached had no chance to even alter the course of the invincible Roman Empire, much less outlast

it. Do you inherently lean more to the view that hope is mostly delusional, useless, and hurtful, or to Paul's view that hope (based on God's saving action) is a crucial result of strong character? What role, if any, has hope played in keeping you going at tough times? Have you ever experienced the progression of trouble, endurance, character, and hope bringing you a powerful sense of God's love being "poured out" in your heart? Later in Romans, Paul wrote, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in faith so that you overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Romans 15:13). How close to "overflowing" is your inner supply of hope today, whether you face good situations, hard ones, or a mix? How can you open your heart and allow God to fill you to overflowing with hope?

Pray - God, I like the image of overflowing with hope—but, many days, I also know that isn't me. Keep me attuned to the ways you are seeking to fill me to overflowing. Shape me into a fountain of hope for those around me. Amen.

Saturday, October 24

Read - Titus 3:1-8

Notice - As his letter to Titus neared its end, Paul summed up both the outward sources and inner springs of the way of life that would make the Christians "good and useful for everyone." In verses 4-7, he quoted what in verse 8 he called a "reliable" saying. The same wording appears four times in the two letters to Timothy. It seems to refer to language drawn from some of the earliest Christian' statements used to express their common faith. Paul didn't aimlessly choose the character qualities he listed. "It's not just that God has decided to set up some new rules, for the sake of it, and that one of them happens to be that Christians should be nice to people.... The reason we are summoned to avoid speaking evil of people, not to be quarrelsome, and so on, is that we are ourselves the creatures of God's generous love, and if we aren't showing that same generous, kindly, forgiving love we have obviously forgotten the path by which we've come."* In what ways does how you treat others reflect and grow from God's gracious treatment of you?

Pray - God, you saved me because of your mercy, not because of righteous things I had done. Thank you for the ways your mercy and grace are reshaping my life. Amen.
